From Vacant Buildings to New Possibilities - Residential & Communal

Kobe City is working hard to address the issue of akiya, or vacant buildings. Here we introduce the hidden potential of vacant houses and how Kobe City supports these projects!

Kodomo Henshu-bu ("Kids Editorial Club") (Shioya-cho, Tarumi Ward) This space was formerly a well-known liquor shop in Shioya. The building has a complicated layout and once housed several households, but it has since been renovated into "heso.", a multi-use complex accommodating a general merchandise store, a florist, and a nail salon. In the rental space on the second floor, the Kids Editorial Club produces free newspapers and other publications for children to share information with their peers. The space is also used for editorial meetings, workshops, a candy shop, and other activities that bring children and the local community together.



KIKKAKE PLACE (Shimogion-cho, Hyogo Ward)

In recent years, shuttered stores have become conspicuous in the Hirano shopping district. The kitchen and counters were renovated, and this space has been turned into a place where people who want to open a store or start a business can trial their business. Currently, a variety of stores including a diner and cafes are running shops in this space.

Job Space Lab (Komagabayashi-cho, Nagata Ward) The Komagabayashi neighborhood is densely filled with old wooden houses and dotted with vacant houses, but it is also an area where community development efforts using contemporary art is thriving. At the request of an organization that supports art activities and community development, a vacant house was turned into a hub for artists to stay, create, and exhibit their works. A café is attached to the house, where visitors can watch the artists at work while enjoying a cup of tea or coffee.



Manmaru House (Ogo-cho, Kita Ward) Although the area is facing a declining birthrate and aging population, it has long been a thriving agricultural area and rich in nature. The couple who purchased this old house asked an architect to design a space that would allow people from both urban and rural areas to interact with each other, and he tried to create a space that would make the most of the original atmosphere and traditional structure. Although the opening is still some time away, plans are underway to open a café where visitors can experience life in a rural area and enjoy coffee and sweets made from locally grown products. Reopening of the Alien Species Institute

Invasive species such as raccoons and red-eared slider turtles not only take away the habitats of native species, but once they take up residence and breed, they can lead to health problems and crop damage.

Last year, the first municipal-level Alien Species Institute was opened to raise awareness of the ecology of invasive species and the problems they pose. The center has a Live Exhibit Wing and a newly opened Exhibition Hall, where visitors can learn about invasive species from listening to explanations by experts, see the actual creatures in person, and engage in fun hands-on activities.

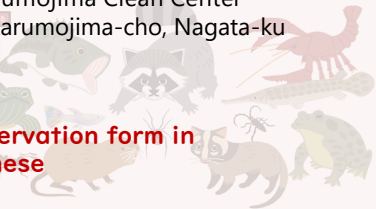

Kobe Black Sea Bream

Also called *chinu* in the Kansai region, black sea bream have recently increased in number, to the extent that they might overfeed on the laver farms on the Suma coast. In winter, these fish develop a thick layer of fat that gives their chewy white flesh an exceptional flavor.

You can enjoy it in many different ways, such as in *takikomi gohan* and carpaccio.

Ibasho for Kids:

Another place where they can say, "I'm home!"

There are more than 200 community welfare centers, neighborhood association halls, and other facilities that offer a safe third place (besides home and school) where elementary- and junior high school-aged kids can eat, do homework, and spend time with their friends and members of the community. Neighbors, university students, and other volunteers watch over the kids as they study.
